









### To and from BNE

**Airtrain** – City to the airport in 22 minutes, meeting 95% of all flights. **Taxis** – located at both the International and Domestic Terminals.

**Buses** – Con-x-ion meets all flights and offers a door to door service to Brisbane CBD, Gold and Sunshine Coasts.

### **Between terminals**


**Free Transfer Bus** – between the Domestic and International Terminals and to Skygate Shopping Precinct.
